

Marking – best practice will include:

- SMART teacher comments / targets
- References to pupils' current level and target level
- Dialogue with students (responding to teacher questions / tasks)
- Comments that demonstrate to pupils how to make progress
- Incorporating DIRT time into lessons so that students can respond appropriately

All Key Stages	
All books should contain	 A Start of Year / Target Level sticker Evidence of literacy – keywords, definitions, labelled diagrams, extended writing. Evidence of numeracy – graphs, magnification, statistical analysis, equations.
Marking	Student's written work should be assessed regularly throughout the year (this could include marking books, test, homework, classwork or any other form of work produced) with evidence of student reflection. Marking and reflection could be in the form of: • Traffic light sticker • Student Self Assessment Sheet • Purple page of progress • Verbal Feedback stamp • 5 minute reflection plan • Exit Stickers • Green pens – peer/self assessment
Teacher Comments	 Purple pens – improving/redrafting work. Minimal but purposeful, subject specific and used to consolidate and/or extend pupils knowledge. e.g. practice question, correction of question/work, challenge question, catch up on missed work, extended writing, problem solving, research, hint or next step.
	Presentation, literacy and numeracy specific comments where appropriate.
